From 1991-2001 he was the Chairman of Surgery at Newton-Wellesley Hospital, Newton, Massachusetts- a member of the Partners Group. Dr Reines moved to Inova Fairfax Hospital in 2001 as the Vice Chair of Surgery and the Founding Program Director for the Surgical Residency at Fairfax. He is the author of over 120 peer-reviewed papers. He has served on numerous editorial boards including the Journal of Trauma, Critical Care Medicine, and the Journal of Surgical Education. He is presently the Chairman of the Council for Graduate Medical Education (COGME) for the Department of Health and Human Services and is a member of the AHRQ advisory board, and is a Governor of the American College of Surgeons. His present interests include surgical education, manpower, and surgical quality.
